It is the intention of the Umzimvubu Local Municipality to enter into a formal contract with a service provider that will carry out the services described hereunder. These specifications and the service provider's proposal will form the basis of the contract.

SECTION 2: SUMMARY OF BRIEF

Extensive proposals are being requested, from service providers who have experience and qualifications in Permaculture, Parks and Recreation Management, Crop production or mixed production on how best they can mentor 8 emerging Umzimvubu farmers. The service provider will assist in running of the Projects which is situated in Mount Frere villages and Mount Ayliff villages. The Service Provider will be responsible with the following: Mentoring of 8 crop producers, 5 farmers from Mount Frere and 3 farmer form Mount Ayliff. The service provider will be also responsible mentoring of organic farming beneficiaries in ward 14 and ward 15. The service provider will be responsible to conduct skill transfer to the beneficiaries and draft monthly reports, as part of the ULM exit strategy.

SECTION 3: PROJECT DESCRIPTION

INTRODUCTION

Umzimvubu Local municipality which falls under Alfred Nzo District Municipality has been identified as a rural node through the Integrated Sustainable Rural Development Programme (ISRDP) in 2001 which means that the area is poverty stricken characteristic of low levels of education, skill and therefore high levels of unemployment.

The municipality has identified 8 Vegetable and crop producers which include maize producers, potatoes, Cabbage, Spinach, onion, beetroot, carrot, peas, beans and butternut etc. The aim is to utilize locally available resources in achieving these aims. The Market will also help in boosting the production capacity of local Agricultural Cooperatives.

BACKGROUND

"Minister in the Presidency: National Planning Commission, Trevor Manuel, said at a media briefing on the implementation of the plan on 19 February 2013, that the National Development Plan (NDP) offers a long term perspective and also it defines a desired destination and identifies the role different sectors of society need to playing reaching that goal.

The NDP aims at to eliminate poverty and to reduce the inequality by 2030. Accouding to the plan, South Africa can realise these goals by drawing on the energies of its people, growing an inclusive economy, building capabilities, enhancing the capacity of the state, and promoting leadership and partnership throughout society.

Minister Manuel highlighted the processes in the implementation of the plan:

The Presidency and Deputy President will be the lead champions of the Plan
within Cabinet, in government and throughout the country. Premiers and Mayors
will need to be visible and active champions of the Plan, with their offices being
the catalytic agencies to drive implementation at provincial and municipal levels.

It is against this background that Umzimvubu Municipality has embarked in this programme.

3.1 PROJECT PURPOSE:

 To select a Service Provider who will have a lease agreement with the Municipality to mentor this farmers, skills transfer to the beneficiaries.

3.2 PROJECT OUTCOMES/ OUTPUTS/ DELIVERABLES

The following outcomes and deliverables are required:

- Giving support to the emerging farmers.
- To improve the quality of farmers produce.
- To train the farmers on crop rotation to able them to produce sustainable production.

- Empowerment of rural communities on crop and vegetables production.
- To link the Farmers with the available market opportunity.
- Assessment of viability of their businesses and a report with recommendations.

3.3 SCOPE OF WORKS

The mentorship programme is as follows:

- 1. All the programmes are done on weekly basis and a full mentoring programme is put on place.
- 2. The farmers are visited as and when required but more and above that the visit programme is done on weekly basis.
- 3. The appointed service provider is expected to prepare these farmers for the Agricultural show which be on the 28 March 2014.

3.4 COMPETENCY / EXPERTISE REQUIREMENTS

In order to complete this task the following expertise and competencies are deemed necessary.

- 1. The service provider must have a proven record of functionality in the field of Parks and Recreation management.
- 2. Knowledge of the Umzimvubu Local area.
- 3. Facilitation / co-ordination skills
- 4. Report writing and presentation skills as it might be required.
- 5. Experience and knowledge in undertaking and completing similar assignments
- 6. Be able to work in partnership with the Municipality
- 7. Able to use participatory learning approach.
- 8. Ability to start immediately after the appointment and carry out the process on a sustained basis until completion within the stipulated time.
