### JOY AS LOWER AND UPPER BROOKSNECK BRIDGE **OFFICIALLY OPENS**

ver a member of years the community of ward 1 Emaxesibeni has been using an unsafe river pane to cross over from lower to upper Brooksneck with no bridge that cuts across to get to the other side. "Finally the community of ward 1 sees the dawn of a well-structured paved bridge after tragic experience of deaths of community members who were swept into the river trying to cross over" says councillor Hem of ward 1. It is said that in the past few year's three people 2 adults and an infant have died crossing the river.

On Thursday 06th June 2019 Umzimvubu local municipality speaker Cllr F.N Ngonyolo officially opened the bridge and said that the municipality is now finishing and wrapping up all the construction of access roads, bridges and community halls which were planned for 2018/19 financial year and hand overs such as this one yet to be done to various wards. Concluding her speech she said "as promised this bridge now belong to the people of Brooksneck, we are doing this as to curb the incidents of death that occur in this bridge". The bridge, Together with the access road, amounts to R3 466 121.55 with an investment of R219 245.00 in labour, creating a total

of 21 jobs to the residing community of ward 1.

The bridge was joyfully welcomed by the residents of ward 1, Mlali Tallbet Nkosiyaphantsi an elderly resident of Brooksneck said that he is very excited about the new bridge that the municipality has constructed for them, "Three people have drowned and died trying to cross the river and such incidents left us reeling in shock" Said Nkosiyaphantsi, he further said "our grandchildren will now use a safer bridge when they are going to school at upper Brooksneck".

While the Brooksneck residents remained over joyed by the handover of the bridge, the residents at Magaitini and Vala also in ward 1 celebrated a well maintained road connecting the two villages Magaitini and KwaVala A/A an amount of R1 234 693.48 was spent on the maintenance of the road with an investment of R97000 in labour creating 13

In a drive for service delivery the mayor of Umzimvubu Local Municipality Cllr Khulile Mnukwa on the 24th may 2019 officially opened the community hall of ward 16 at Ext 07. "It has been years using an unsafe building structure that was built by the community and championed by one of the struggle fighters the late Vuyani Limako". "it was during the time when the construction of RDP housing

at ward 16 commenced that Limako Became concerned that Limako became concerned on where the community will gather for meetings, he the decided to build the support centre" say Margaret Mabhumbulu a community member of ward 16.

The building structure had serious structural cracks, falling roof structure and serious water leaks during rainfalls.

The structure did not have ablution facilities and the structure was not electrified. In implementing one of the 7 objectives which is 'to provide access to improved, sustainable and modernised infrastructure' the Umzimvubu Local Municipality's council took a resolution to improve and refurbish the structure and provide a proper building that will be used for community gatherings. A local

contractor was appointed and it is pleasing to note that 18 local residents were employed in this project.

In welcome of the municipal's initiative the community of ward 16 decided to name the Support Centre after Vuyani Limako who was the pillar and champion of the struggle in the ward and later built the former Ext 07 Support Centre. In his handover the Hon

Mayor Cllr Mnukwa said "in terms of the Heritage Act, the hall in Ext 7 is not regarded as the community hall but a memorial hall since it is in commemoration of the late Vuyani Limako". He further added that Limako was not a hidden leader, but he was an authentic leader who was dedicated in fighting for the community.

# #SONA19 DATA COSTS LIKELY FALL 10 THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW FROM THE STATE OF THE NATION ADDRESS

he president of the Republic of South Africa, Mr Cyril Ramaphosa delivered the first state of the Nation Address (SONA) of the 6th parliament on the 20th June 2019, under the theme: "Let's grow South Africa together as we celebrate 25 years of freedom, "Here are ten things to note from the address.

1. A special appropriation bill is to be tabled to allocate a significant portion of the R230bn that Eskom needs to pay its debtors and keep the lights on

- 2. The president has reaffirmed the constitutional mandate of the Reserve Bank "to protect the value of our currency in the interest of balanced and sustainable growth"
- 3. The minister of communications has been instructed to issue policy direction to the independent Communications Authority of SA (ICASA) to begin licencing spectrum that will significantly reduce data costs
- 4. To return public money that has been stolen, civil claims arising of investigations of the special investigative unit (SIU), estimated to be around R14.7bn, will be fast-tracked.
- 5. Implement a comprehensive plan, driven by the presidency to create two million jobs for young people over the next 10 years
- 6. Double international tourist arrivals to 21-Million by 2030, by introducing a "world

class regime" and focusing on tourists from china, India and the rest of Africa

- 7. Government will accelerate efforts to identify and release public land that is suitable for smart, urban settlements and for farming
- 8. Establish a gender-based violence and femicide council to guide government efforts to eradicate gender-based violence
- 9. Train foundation and intermediate phase teachers

to teach reading in English and African languages, and to deploy experienced coaches to provide on-site support to teachers

10. The president dreams of the first new city built in the democratic era with skyscrapers, schools, universities, hospitals and factories; to ease the pressure on the congested cities of Tshwane, Joburg, Ethekwini and Cape Town



### **UMZIMVUBU LOCAL MUNICIPALITY RESPONDS TO NCUNTENI PETITION**

n the 15th July 2019, Umzimvubu Local Municipality visited Ncunteni Village in KwaBhaca to respond to a service delivery petition submitted by local residents in the area. According to the petition submitted on the 16th June 2019, residents are disgruntled with the closure of 'Ncunteni to

Mtsane Access Road'. Subsequent to the submission made by Ncunteni local residents, the road was reported closed by the residing Traditional leader, Thandisizwe Tholelengwe Diko, who at the time claimed that the road intercepted his land. The matter has since been referred to court for further ruling.

The municipal delegation led by the Speaker of Council, Cllr Florida Ngonyolo, presented a remedial plan for residents to gain access to government services and other day to day operations. "All residing communities in Umzimvubu are to gain equal access to quality roads and infrastructure. It's worth

noting that the site inspection has been conducted and an alternative route of 5.25 km will be constructed in the interim. The municipality is working tirelessly to ensure that there is no interruption caused to service delivery." said Ngonyolo.

After numerous municipal attempts to resolve the matter, it's unfortunate to note that Ncunteni residents have rejected the municipal proposal to construct a new route in the interim.

The municipality remains committed to restore unity in the area and will continue engaging all parties concerned until the matter is resolved.
